They must learn to step out of their comfort zones.


They must be equipped with the right skills: academic skills and people skills.





CURRICULUM & KEY STAGES

SKIPS is modelled on the National Curriculum of England.

The primary system has three phases and eight year groups:

EYFS: FS1 & FS2 (age 3-5)

Key Stage 1: Year 1 & Year 2 (age 5 – 7)

Key Stage 2: Year 3 – Year 6 (age 7 – 11)
